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

SUD is Prevalent in Acute Care Settings

- 1 in 9 hospitalizations
- *12-month mortality after hospital discharge is 7.8%
- *\$13.2 billion/year on acute care visits involving SUD



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Hospital-Based Harm Reduction

"They were not judgmental; they were not expecting me to say things that would lead me to failure... which has been my experience in the past.... Can you imagine how many people or how many lives we could save if there was not this kind of barrier?"

-Person who uses methamphetamine

Impacts of our Harm Reduction Intervention:

- Increased access to education and supplies, especially for marginalized populations
- Rebuilt trust by improving care experience
- Catalyzed culture change and destigmatization

Challenges:

- Hesitancy regarding legality
- Limited SUD education among staff
- * Remaining stigma
- Careful assessment of patient goals
